Like Johann Strauss, father and son, he was a great European musician, and many people still think his music

15. (2021 秋·鼓楼区校级期末) The Sequoia National Forest is in California's Sierra Nevada Mountains. It is home to the most massive trees in the world. At its entrance is the Trail of 100 Giants. This is a short, easy paved trail that people can walk. It gives visitors great views of more than a hundred sequoias (美洲杉). These trees grow only in the special geology of the slopes of the Sierra Nevadas. The largest of the trees is 20 feet around and 220 feet tall. You almost need a telescope to see the top of it!

The sequoia trees that line the Trail of 100 Giants have stood for generations. Many of them started growing in the Middle Ages. The trees watched the first European settle in California. They grew through the Gold Rush in the mid - 1800s and have lived through two world wars. The trees were declared a national monument (纪念) in 2000.

Then, in October of 2011, two of the giants fell. One photographer from Germany recorded the trees crashing to the ground with a video camera. Watchers were astonished (吃惊地) that these enormous trees could topple like babies trying to take their first step. One explanation was that the summer had been very wet. The ground was

quite hydrated. The earth may have been too soggy (湿软) to hold the shallow roots of the trees.

Some officials fear that the foot traffic from tourists might have weakened the trees. Even pollution from cars visiting the park could have damaged them. It might be, though, that the trees were simply old. It was the time in their life cycle to die.

The trees may have been as much as 1,500 years old. They were more than 200 feet tall. The two that fell were connected at their base. Part scientists believe that when the first one fell, it brought the second one down with it.

What should be done with the fallen trees? They fell across a popular path. The trunks are too big for most walkers to climb over. The path they block is designed for people in wheelchairs. There is no other path that these people can use. The Park Service asked the public what they thought.

Many biologists think the trees should be left just as they are. Letting nature take its course. Some people feel that the Forest Service should drill a tunnel through the trunks, allowing people simply to walk through. Some want to build a bridge over the trees, and some think the path should go around the trees.

Park officials have decided to take their time deciding what to do. Since the trees are national monuments now, any decision must be carefully considered. The sequoias are a rare treasure. Even in death, they should be treated with respect.

This charity offers children who live in poorer, inner - cities the chance to come and stay on a working farm for a week. Children learn from hands - on experience about how to care for animals and how to work with others as part of a team. The charity is still running today, and thousands of children have been to stay at one of the three farms that the charity now owns.

Michael Morpurgo has written more than 100 books for children. He writes about children and their relationships with older people and animals. He also writes stories about wars. Many of them have won prizes and several are now films or plays, including War Horse, which is now well known around the world. Another popular book is Kensuke's Kingdom, which he wrote in 1999.

16. (2021 秋·南京期末) Michael Morpurgo was born on 5th October, 1943 in the south of England. He and his brother were moved from London when the Second World War began. Michael went to two different boarding schools when he was growing up. He particularly enjoyed playing rugby and singing but he often felt homesick and missed home. After school, Michael joined the army but he did not enjoy being shouted at and so he left shortly afterwards. Michael then decided to go to university instead.

After graduating from university, Michael became a primary school teacher and taught in a small school in Kent. He loved teaching and his favourite thing to do was to read stories to his class. When he ran out of stories to read to them, Morpurgo started to write his own. His first book was written in 1974 and was called "It Never Rains: Five Stories". Morpurgo has stated that the days he spent teaching are some of the happiest of his life.

Michael left teaching after ten years and bought a farm with his wife. Together they began a charity called Farms for City Children. This charity offers children who live in poorer, inner - cities the chance to come and stay on a working farm for a week. Children learn from hands - on experience about how to care for animals and how to work with others as part of a team. The charity is still running today, and thousands of children have been to stay at one of the three farms that the charity now owns.

Michael Morpurgo has written more than 100 books for children. He writes about children and their relationships with older people and animals. He also writes stories about wars.
