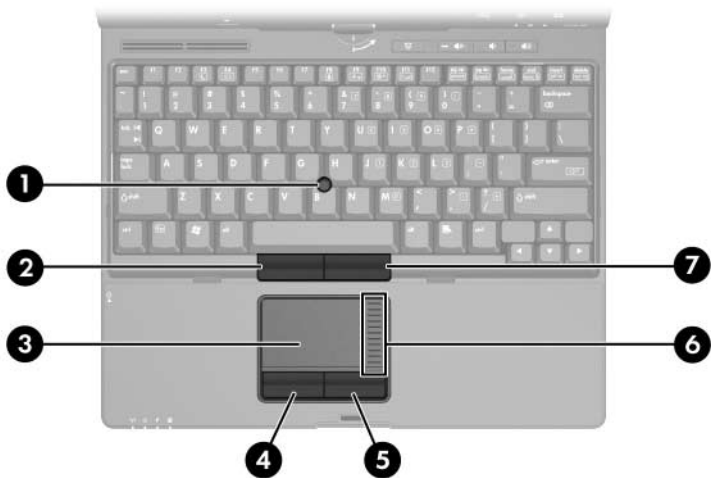

# Identifying pointing devices



The pointing stick and TouchPad controls can be used interchangeably.

| Component                    | Description                                                                                                                                                     |
|------------------------------|-----------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------|
| ❶ Pointing stick             | Moves the pointer and selects or activates items on the screen.                                                                                                 |
| ❷ Left pointing stick button | Functions like the left button on an external mouse.                                                                                                            |
| ❸ TouchPad*                  | Moves the pointer and selects or activates items on the screen. Can be set to perform other mouse functions, such as scrolling, selecting, and double-clicking. |

## Using the TouchPad

To move the pointer, slide your finger across the TouchPad surface in the direction you want the pointer to go. Use the TouchPad buttons as you would the corresponding buttons on an external mouse. To scroll up and down using the TouchPad vertical scroll zone, slide your finger up and down over the lines.

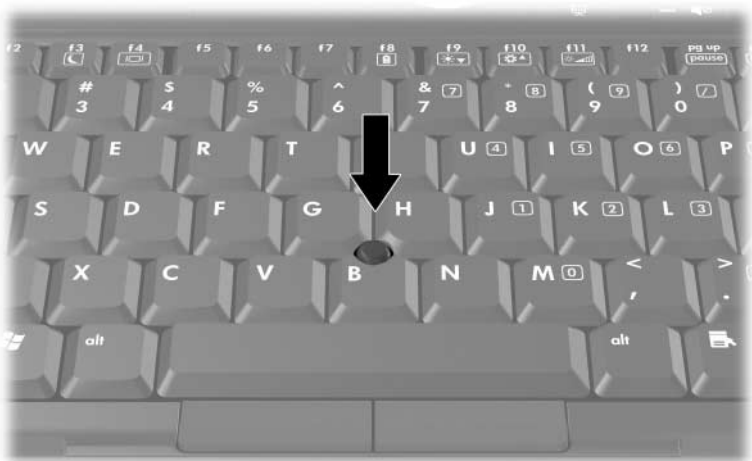


If you are using the TouchPad to move the pointer, you must lift your finger off the TouchPad before moving it to the scroll zone. Simply sliding your finger from the TouchPad to the scroll zone will not activate the scrolling function.

## Using the pointing stick

To move the pointer, press the pointing stick in the direction you want the pointer to go. Use the pointing stick buttons as you would the corresponding buttons on an external mouse.



## Using an external mouse

An external USB mouse can be connected to the computer using one of the USB ports on the computer. A USB mouse can also be connected to the system using the ports on an optional docking device.

## Setting pointing device preferences

Mouse Properties in Microsoft® Windows® allows you to customize pointing device settings, including

- TouchPad tapping, which enables you to tap the TouchPad once to select an object or twice to double-click an object (enabled by default).
- Edge motion, which enables you to continue to scroll even though your finger has reached the edge of the TouchPad (disabled by default).
- Button preference, which allows you to switch between left-hand and right-hand use (right-hand preference is enabled by default).

Other features, such as mouse speed preferences and mouse trails, are also found in Mouse Properties.

To access Mouse Properties:

- » Select **Start > Control Panel > Printers and Other Hardware > Mouse**.

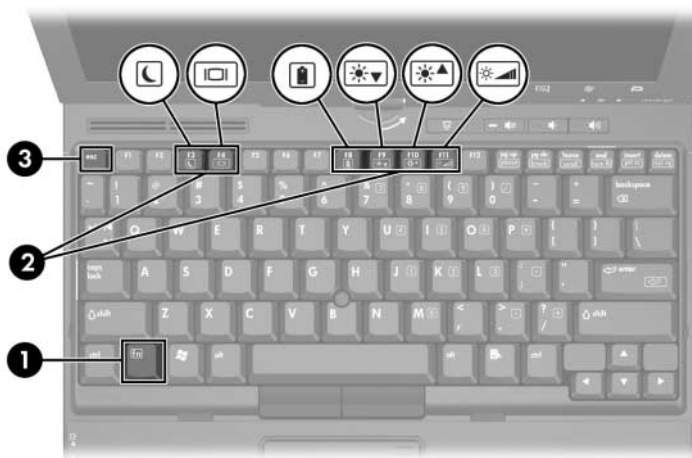
# Keyboard

The following sections provide information on the keyboard features of the computer.

## Hotkeys

Hotkeys are preset combinations of the **fn** key ❶, one of the function keys ❷, or the **esc** key ❸.

The icons on the **f3**, **f4**, and **f8** through **f11** keys represent the hotkey functions. Hotkey functions and procedures are discussed in the following sections.
