Text 1

W: Pass me the orange juice, please?

M: Sorry, I didn’t hear that. The kids are making such a noise.

W: I like peace and quiet while dining. They should play their pop songs elsewhere.

W: No, our kid has slept soundly. (2) It was one of those wild turkeys in the neighborhood. They like to hit our door and windows with their heads. They're worse than the cat!

Text 3

M: I was thinking about a ski trip, but we can save that for February. (3)

Text 4

Text 5

Text 6

W: I got my driver's license the day I turned 18, but my parents didn't let me drive till three years later. (6)

M: My parents bought me a second-hand car when I got my driver's license.

W: You are lucky. I had to have all of my friends drive me around for years! They were all older than me by a few months and still had their licenses before I did. What month were you born in? I was born in September. My birthday is exactly two months

after my sister's!

M: I was born on Christmas actually. (7) It gets a little annoying because we have to celebrate both and I don't get my own day!

Text 7

W: How was your camping trip last weekend, John?

M: Not great. The first night we stayed at one of those camping areas where you need to pay to get in. There were too many people there, though. (8) (9)

W: So, what happened next?

M: The next day we decided to hike about four hours to a spot where there wasn't anybody around. (9) That was a big mistake.

W: Why?

M: None of us brought anything to make a fire with. Then it started raining, and we realized even with our warm clothes it was too cold to stay overnight.

W: So what did you do?

M: We hiked back to the original camping area in complete darkness. We left the next morning because everyone was too tired from the night before. (9) What did you do?

W: I watched a movie at home by a nice wood fire.

Text 8

M: Roger is so intelligent. (10) He thinks for himself. He's a hard worker. He has good ideas and he doesn't follow the crowd.

W: So why does he do so badly in his exams? (10)

M: Because he suffers from anxiety. He lacks confidence. (10) His brain is so active and he thinks too much. When it comes to exams, his intelligence actually works against him.

W: I wish we could help him. It seems so unfair that a person's future can be determined by how well they perform on one particular day.

M: It is unfair — but life is unfair. We must try to help him by showing him how to keep calm in stressful situations. (11)

W: How do we do that? I can't say that I'm exactly an expert at dealing with stress, although I am better at it than I used to be.

M: I can help him. I always think that exercise is a great way for dealing with stress and anxiety. When you have exhausted yourself while doing exercise, you don't have the energy to be nervous. (12)

W: That is so right! I always feel calm after working out in the gym. (12)

Text 9

M: How is the job hunt going? (13)

W: I've applied to more than 20 jobs and had three interviews. I got two job offers but I do not really like either of them. (13)

M: Why not?

W: Neither of them gave me a good salary offer. I think I deserve more than that.

M: Have you researched what kind of salary your position should earn?

W: Yes, and I should be getting much more than what they are offering me.

M: Well, do you like the companies and the benefits they are offering you?

W: I do, especially one of them called The Creator. (14) They got a lot of great reviews from their employees, and they are offering a great benefits package which includes medical and dental insurance and more holiday time than any other company. (14)

M: That's great. Don't just decline the job offer. You know what, you can negotiate the salary offer they give you. (16)

W: I'd been at the company we were at for so long. (15) I forgot about the job process. I am a little worried about asking for more.

M: Listen! If they offered you a job, that means they want you! Especially in your field, data analytics, you are needed in today's job market. Everyone needs people to figure out what to do with all the data being collected.

W: You have a point. I will give them a call right now. (16)

Text 10 (第 20 题为总结题)

Hello everyone, and thank you for inviting me to speak at your school. (17)

Now here is a big word for you — volcanologist. That is my job. Volcanology is the study of volcanoes and I spend much of my time traveling to volcanoes around the world. China can count itself lucky. It doesn't have many active volcanoes. The last one to erupt was in 1951. My job has taken me to many countries, from Italy to the U.S. I have just come back from Indonesia, (18) one of the most active volcanic areas. So why is my job important? Because when we understand volcanoes, we can predict how they will behave and help protect the people who live near them from possible harm. When we think of volcanoes erupting, we think of rocks but perhaps the biggest danger is from ash. There have been some very famous volcano eruptions. Krakatoa, in Indonesia, erupted in 1883, killing over 36,000 people. Santorini, in Greece, was ruined by an explosion about 3600 years ago. But the most famous eruption was Vesuvius in Italy in 79 AD. (19) Ash from the explosion buried the Roman towns of Pompeii and Herculaneum, preserving them so well that we can now visit them today. They are a treasure for historians, so you could say every volcanic cloud has a silver lining.

第二部分：阅读理解

【导语】这是一篇应用文。介绍了剑桥大学校园开放日相关信息。

21. 推理判断题。根据第一段“Every July and September, the University of Cambridge opens its doors to welcome prospective applicants and their parents and supporters to find out what it’s really like to live and study here. (每年七月和九月，剑桥大学都会敞开大门，欢迎潜在的申请人及其父母和支持者了解在这里生活和学习的真实感受)”推知，对剑桥大学的开放日最感兴趣的应该是潜在的申请人，即可能前往该校读书的学生。故选 B 项。

22. 细节理解题。根据第四段第一句“The programme will run from 9 : 30-16 : 30 (UK time) and is similar on both days so you should only need to attend one of the days. (该项目在 9:30-16:30(英国时间) 进行，两天的内容相似，所以你只需要参加其中一天。)”可知，作者建议 7 月开放日的两天只参加一天。故选 D 项。

23. 细节理解题。根据 Booking information“预定信息”部分第一点“To attend our Open Days you must register in advance.(要参加我们的开放日，您必须提前注册)”和“Bookings for our September Open Day will open in summer 2023, after the July Open Days.(我们 9 月开放日的预订将在 2023 年夏季开放,即七月开放日之后)”可知，9 月的开放日应该是在 7 月开放日后报名。故选 C 项。

24. D 25. D 26. B 27. C

【导语】这是一篇记叙文，文章主要讲的是作者在 40 多岁的时候申请成为一名兼职学生，之后不断努力学习，终于能够写出一篇合适的学术论文的故事。

24. 推理判断题。根据第二段的“The pages were covered in red writing, pointing out errors. There must have been a mistake.(书页上用红色字体标出错误。一定是弄错了)”同时结合第一段讲的“作者对自己的论文很满意”可知，作者在收到第一篇论文的分數后觉得惊讶，故选 D。

25. 细节理解题。根据第三段的“University started later for me than most. The opportunity wasn't available when I was younger — too many kids in our family and too little money.(我上大学比大多数人都晚。在我年轻的时候，没有这样的机会——家里孩子太多，钱太少)”可知，作者上大学比其他人晚是因为他的家庭不够富裕。故选 D。

26. 细节理解题。根据倒数第二段的“While I kept studying and kept learning, I learned to love two dozen writers I had never heard of before and explored types of literature I had never examined. Eventually, I learned how to write an essay in proper academic prose.(在我不断学习的过程中，我学会欣赏二十几位我从未听说过的作家，并探索了我从未研究过的文学类型。最终，我学会了如何用正确的学术散文写一篇文章)”可知，不断的努力帮助作者写出一篇合适的学术论文。故选 B。

27. 主旨大意题。通读全文，尤其是倒数第二段的“While I kept studying and kept learning, I learned to love two dozen writers I had never heard of before and explored types of literature I had never examined. Eventually, I learned how to write an essay in proper academic prose.(在我不断学习的过程中，我学会欣赏二十几位我从未听说过的作家，并探索了我从未研究过的文学类型。最终，我学会了如何用正确的学术散文写一篇文章)”可知，本文主要讲的是作者在 40 多岁的时候申请成为一名兼职学生，之后不断努力学习，终于能够写出一篇合适的学术论文的故事，说明了“有志者事竟成”这个道理，因此最好的题目是 C 选项“Where There Is A Will, There Is A Way(有志者事竟成)”；故选 C。

【导语】本文是说明文。介绍了一项新的研究发现动物似乎也能像人一样，知道在交谈中什么时候该说话，什么时候该听。

28. 细节理解题。根据第一段中“A good conversation should proceed like a tennis match: players each take turns responding, knowing instinctively when to speak and when to listen. This kind of complicated and back-and-forth talk is often considered to be possessed only by humans.(一场好的谈话应该像一场网球比赛一样进行：球员们轮流做出反应，本能地知道什么时候该说，什么时候该听。这种复杂而反复的谈话通常被认为只有人类才拥有)”可知，我们能从轮流行为中了解到，它具有复杂性和交互性。故选 D 项。

29. 细节理解题。根据第三段中“While forms of communication are mostly sound-based, several species have more creative forms of viewable communication. Baby monkeys let their parents know they want to be carried with arm gestures, while birds, insects and frogs can get their messages across through colorful displays.(虽然交流形式主要是基于声音，但一些物种有更有创意的可视交流形式。猴子宝宝用手势让父母知道它们想被抱着，而鸟类、昆虫和青蛙可以通过彩色的展示来传达信息)”结合选项可知，青蛙展示皮肤颜色属于视觉交流的一种形式。故选 A 项。

30. 推理判断题。根据第五段中“Additionally, while the idea of turn-taking might bring to mind a picture of orderly, well-mannered animals, Kendrick stresses that this isn’t always the case. Owl chicks may try to outdo each other by making louder sounds in an effort to attract favor from their mothers during feeding. “This can be seen as an exception to the rule, highlighting the importance of turn-taking in general,” says Kendrick.(此外，虽然轮流的想法可能会让人想到一幅有序、彬彬有礼的动物画面，但肯德里克强调，情况并非总是如此。在喂食过程中，猫头鹰雏鸟可能会试图通过发出更大的声音来吸引母亲的青睐。Kendrick 说：这可以被视为规

则的一个例外，突出了轮流的重要性。”)可知，第 5 段提到了“owl chicks”是为了和有序、彬彬有礼的动物画面做对比。故选 B 项。

31. 推理判断题。根据最后一段中“One problem with the study is that researchers themselves don’t know how to communicate with others outside their particular species of interest. Kendrick stresses another goal of the study is to create a wider framework that can bring together all the different researches on turn-taking, allowing scientists to conduct more cross-species comparisons. “We all believe strongly these fields can benefit from each other, and we hope the study will drive more crosstalk between humans and animals in the future,” says Kendrick.(这项研究的一个问题是，研究人员自己不知道如何与他们感兴趣的特定物种之外的其他人交流。Kendrick 强调，这项研究的另一个目标是创建一个更广泛的框架，将所有不同的轮转研究汇集在一起，使科学家能够进行更多的跨物种比较。Kendrick 说：‘我们都坚信这些领域可以相互受益，我们希望这项研究将在未来推动人类和动物之间更多的交流。’)可知，最后一段强调了研究的目标，也就是研究范围。故选 B 项。

【导语】本文是一篇议论文。文章讨论了大脑训练应用程序在提高认知能力和智力方面的有效性，说明了虽然这些应用程序可以提高一些特定技能，例如算术和记忆能力，但对其他技能的益处有限，并且它们的整体有效性是值得怀疑的。作者还建议，解谜视频游戏可能提供了一种更复杂和有效的训练认知能力的方式。

32. 细节理解题。根据第二段中“‘There are plenty of brain training apps, but they all share the same characteristics: they turn mental exercises like simple arithmetic (算术), memory tests and logic and pattern-matching problems into quick games. (有很多大脑训练应用程序，但它们都有相后的特点：它们将简单的算术、记忆测试、

可知，脑力训练应用程序的

共同点是：把简单的算术、记忆测试、逻辑匹配等脑力练习变成了快速游戏，它们以游戏的形式发挥作用。故选 B 项。

33. 短语猜测题。根据第二段中“Some apps tell us that the more you play these mini-games, the smarter you will get. It is really a big promise. (一些应用程序告诉我们，你玩这些迷你游戏越多，你就会变得越聪明。这真的是一个很大的承诺。)”可知，作者认为靠玩游戏变聪明是一个很大的承诺。结合第四段中“The positive effects that have been found are limited to the very specific mini-games and tasks that users are trained on, such as the ability to memorize lists of words or numbers, or perform mental arithmetic, with little benefit to other skills. (已经发现的积极影响仅限于非常特定的小游戏和用户接受训练的任务，比如记忆单词或数字列表的能力，或进行心算的能力，对其他技能几乎没有好处。)”可知，通过玩游戏进行的脑力训练对认知功能等其他技能没有好处，故可知这一很大的承诺并不能达成。因此，可推测作者认为脑力训练的理念违背了人类思考和学习的原理，并未达到预期效果。故可推测短语 **flies in the face of** 意为“与……相反”故选 C 项。

34. 推理判断题。根据第四段“The positive effects that have been found are limited to the very specific mini-games and tasks that users are trained on, such as the ability to memorize lists of words or numbers, or perform mental arithmetic, with little benefit to other skills. (已经发现的积极影响仅限于非常特定的小游戏和用户接受训练的任务，比如记忆单词或数字列表的能力，或进行心算的能力，对其他技能几乎没有好处。)”可知，已知的脑力训练的积极影响仅限于非常特定的一些小游戏和训练任务，但对其他技能几乎没有好处。由此推知，脑力训练对记忆力的提高具有局限性。故选 A 项。
