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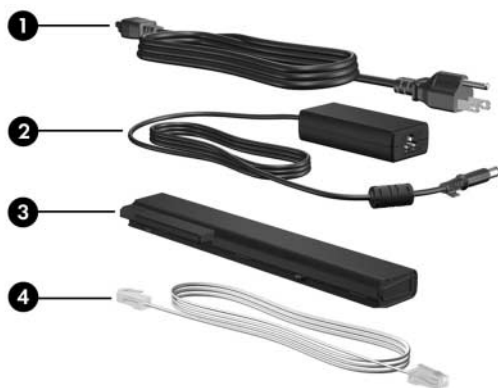
First-time setup

Identifying hardware for setup

To set up the computer for the first time, you will need the computer, the power cord, AC adapter, the battery, and the modem cable (select models only).



Components included with the computer may vary by region and by model.



Component	Component
❶ Power cord	❸ Battery
❷ AC adapter	❹ Modem cable (select models only)



Use only the AC adapter provided with the computer or one approved for this computer.



A modem cable is required only for dial-up networking.

Setting up the computer

Computer setup involves the following tasks:

1. Inserting the battery into the computer
2. Connecting the computer to external power
3. Turning on the computer
4. Setting up the software
5. Creating recovery discs (recommended)



The battery begins to charge.

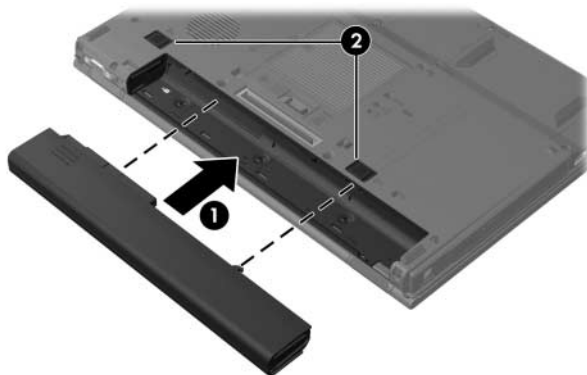
CAUTION: Reduce the risk of file corruption by observing the following practices during the hardware and software setup procedures:

- Do not unplug the computer from external power.
- Do not shut down the computer or initiate Sleep or Hibernation.

Step 1: Insert the battery

To insert the battery:

1. Turn the computer upside down on a flat surface, with the battery bay toward you.
2. Slide the battery ❶ into the battery bay until it is seated. The battery release latches ❷ automatically lock the battery into place.



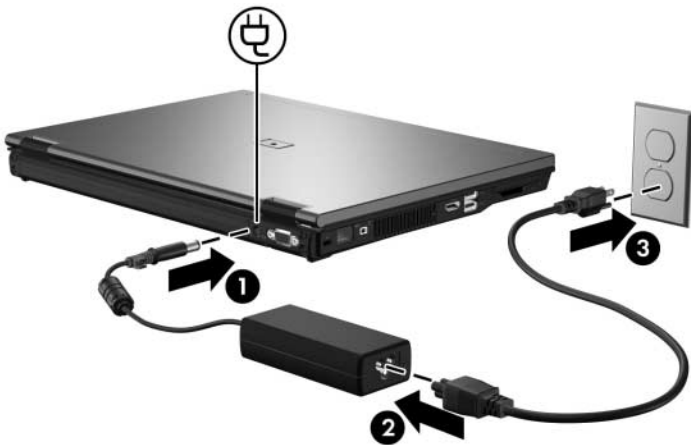
Step 2: Connect the computer to external power



Power cords and AC outlets vary in appearance by region and country.

To connect the computer to external AC power:

1. Plug the AC adapter into the power connector **1** on the computer.
2. Plug the power cord into the AC adapter **2**.
3. Plug the other end of the power cord into an AC outlet **3**.



When the computer receives AC power, the battery begins to charge and the battery light (on the front of the computer) turns on. When the battery is fully charged, the battery light turns off.

Leave the computer connected to external power until the battery is fully charged and the battery light turns off.



A partially charged new battery can run the computer after software setup is complete, but battery charge displays will not be accurate until the new battery has been fully charged.

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
