Twenty years ago only a very small number of people had the skills and equipment to make fake money. Today computer, copier and printer technology is so advancing that almost anyone can make fake money. With the new technology there is a new kind of casual faking machine. The number of bills made by casual fakers on their home and office computer is growing fast. In fact, this number has doubled every year since 1989! There is no way to stop casual faking completely. But the government has recently found a few ways to make casual faking very difficult.

One way is to put very, very small words, called microprints, in many places on the bill. The words are only 6/1000 inch. No one can read them without a magnifying glass, and they are too small to come out on a copier. If someone copies a bill that has microprints, the microprint words on the bill will only be black lines.



Another way to stop people from making fake money on their home computers is to use special colour-changing ink. Money printed with this ink will look green from the front and yellow from the back. Home computers cannot use colour-changing ink. Copies from a home computer only have normal ink and that can be copied quite easily.

38, money is made on special paper with very fine pieces of red and blue silk mixed in. And on each bill there is a special line that runs from the top to the bottom. The lines turn red if you put it under a special light. This line and this special paper with red and blue silk are not easy to copy. 39.

The government must try many different ways to stop making fake money. It needs to keep the way money is made because if fakers can learn to copy the changes, today's copiers cannot copy microprinted words or colour-changing ink. But, in a few years, who knows?
