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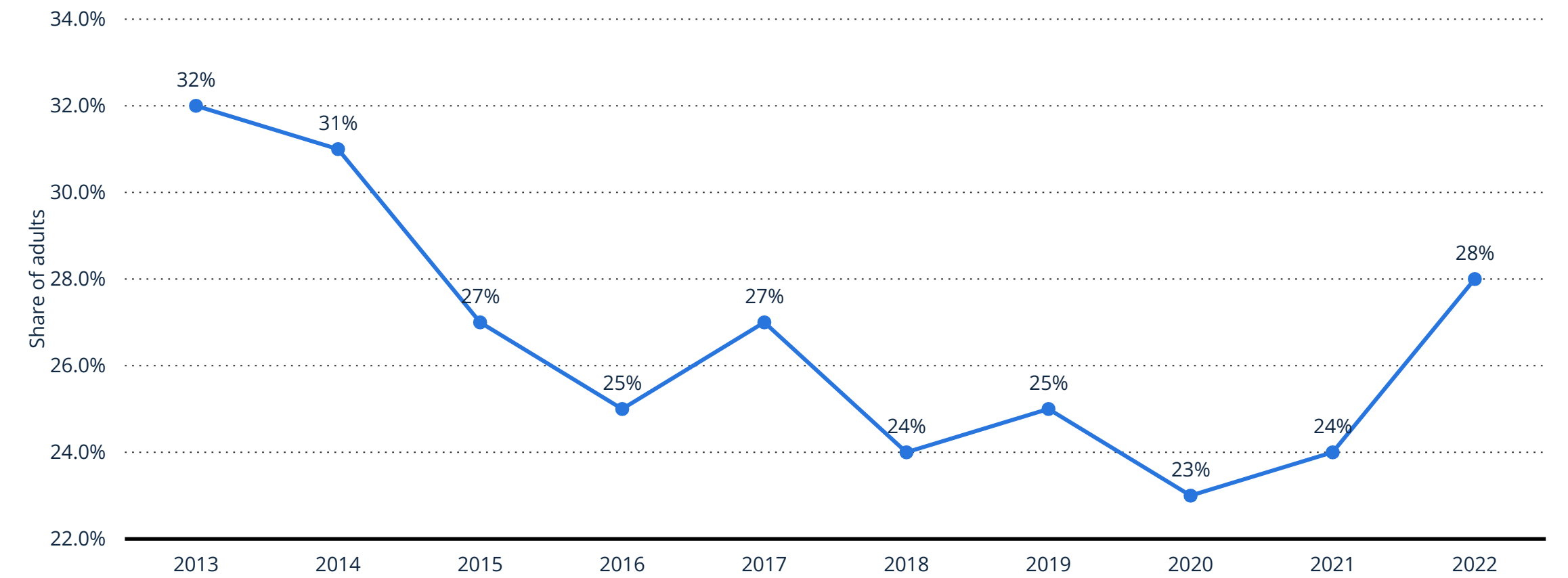

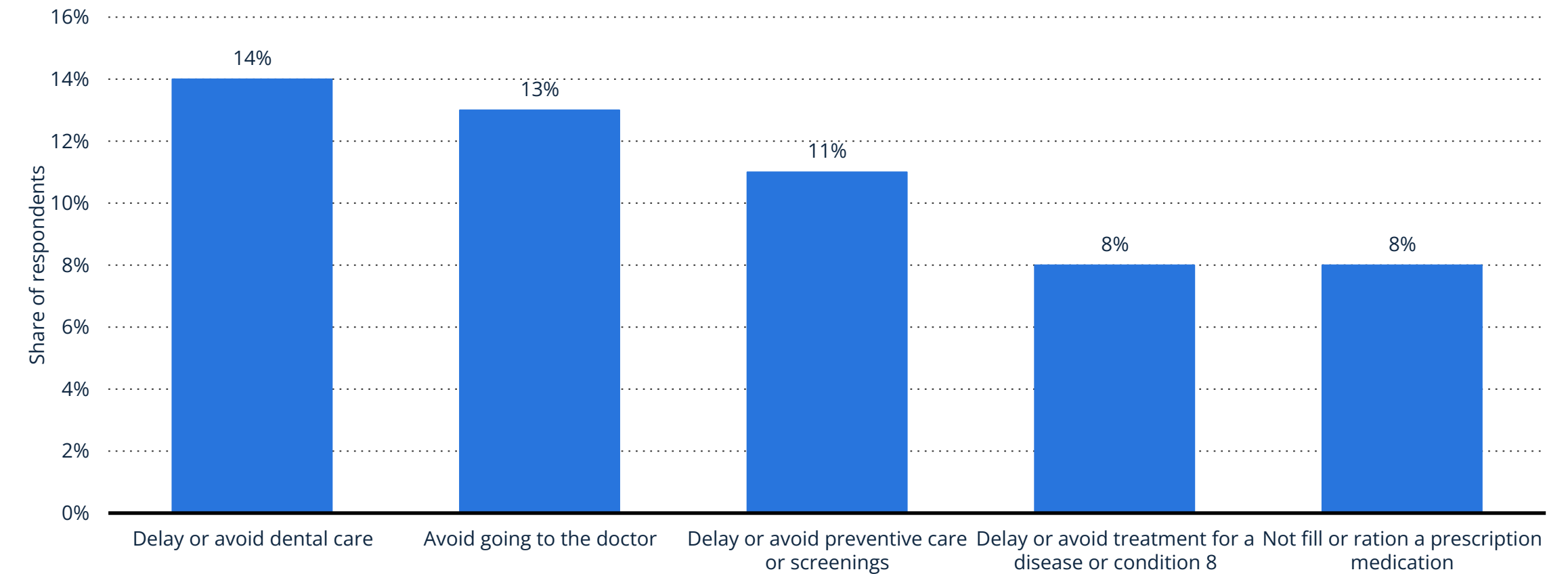
Share of U.S. population who went without needed medical care due to cost in the U.S. between 2013 and 2022

U.S. population who had to forgo medical care due to cost 2000-2022



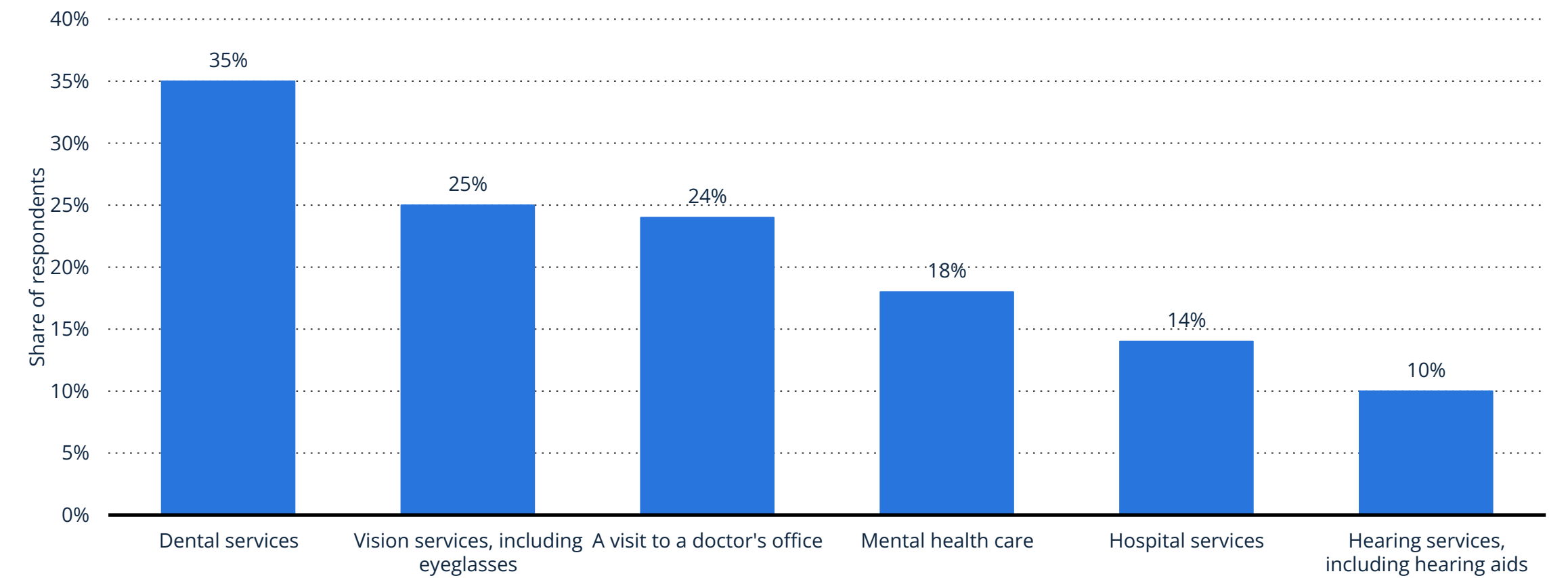
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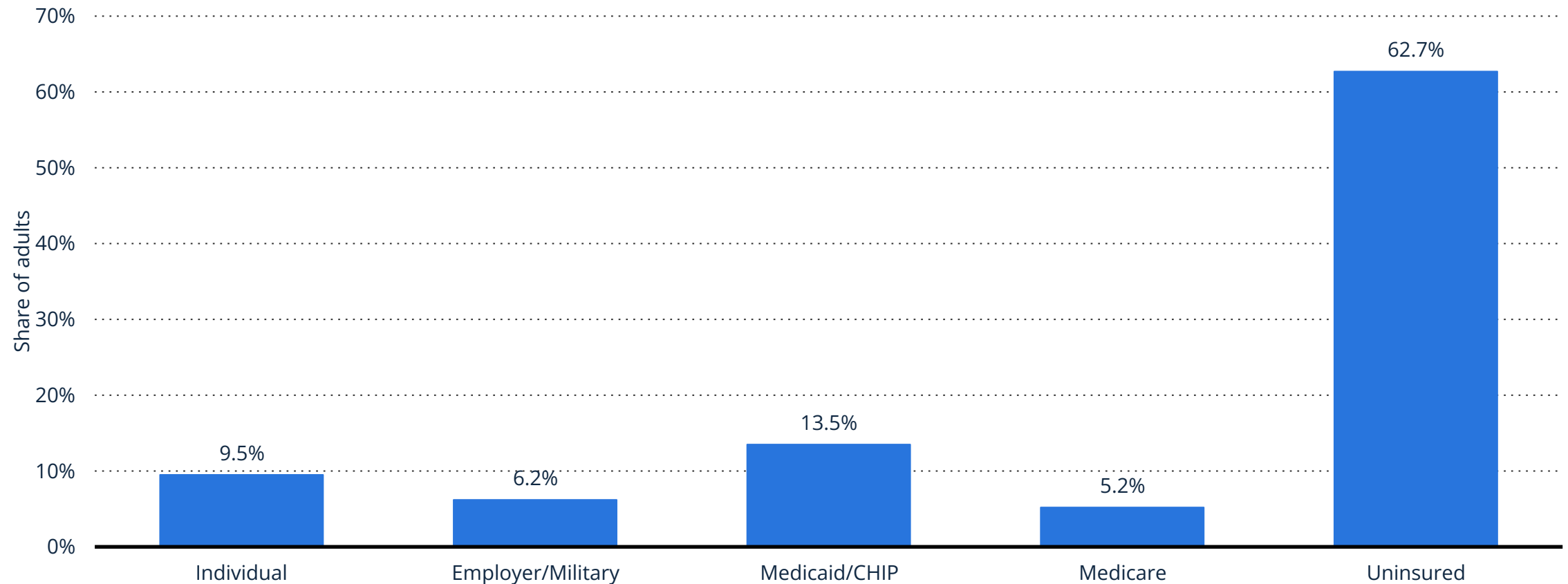
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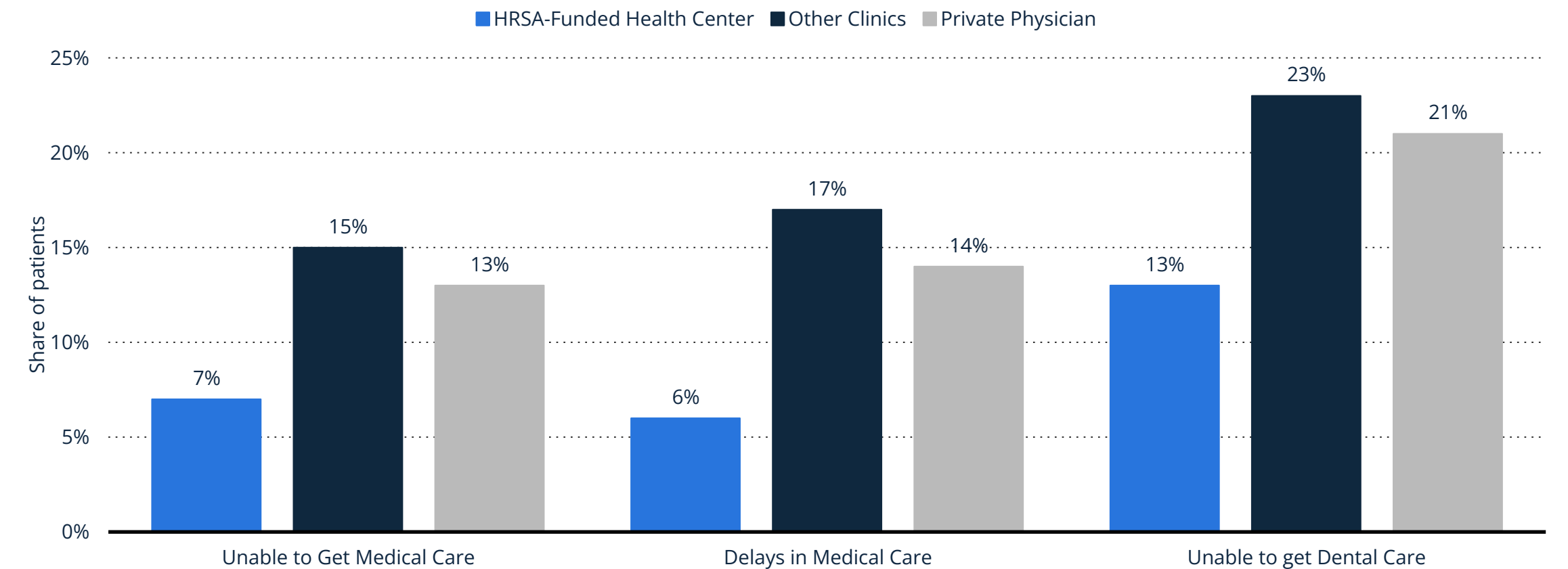
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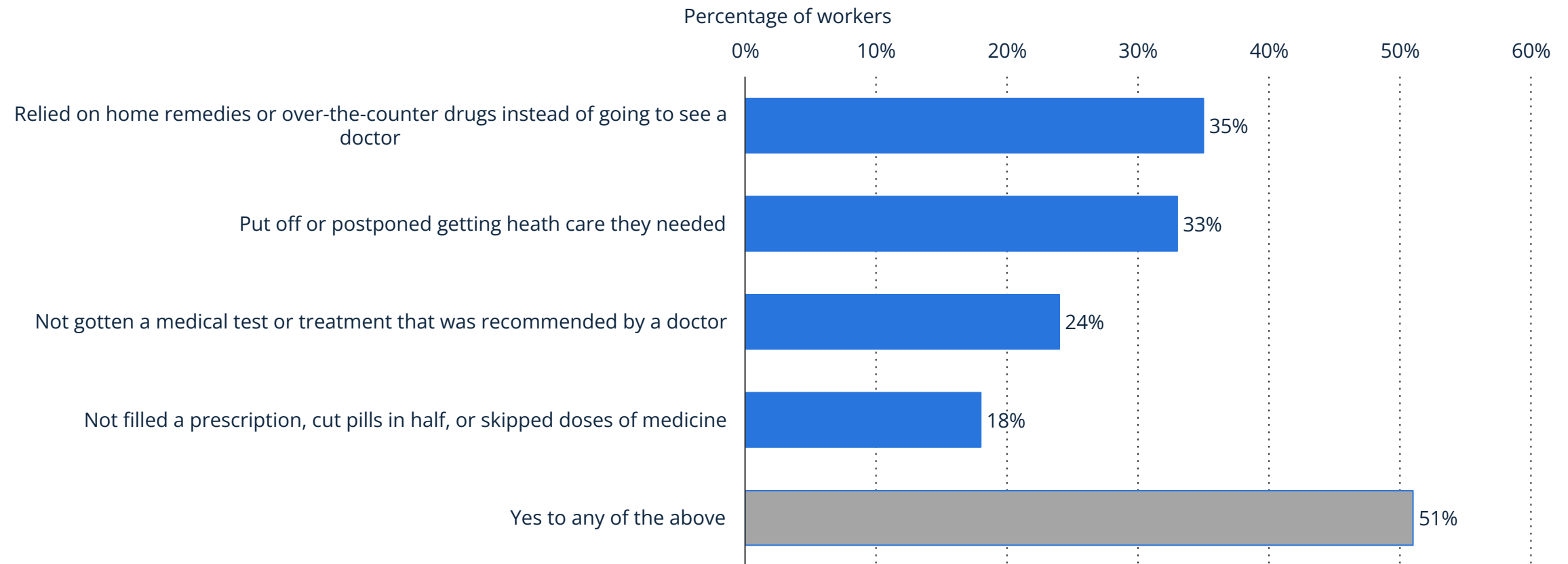
Share of patients who had unmet or delayed healthcare needs in the United States in 2019, by source of care

U.S. workers with employer insurance who skipped health care due to cost, 2018

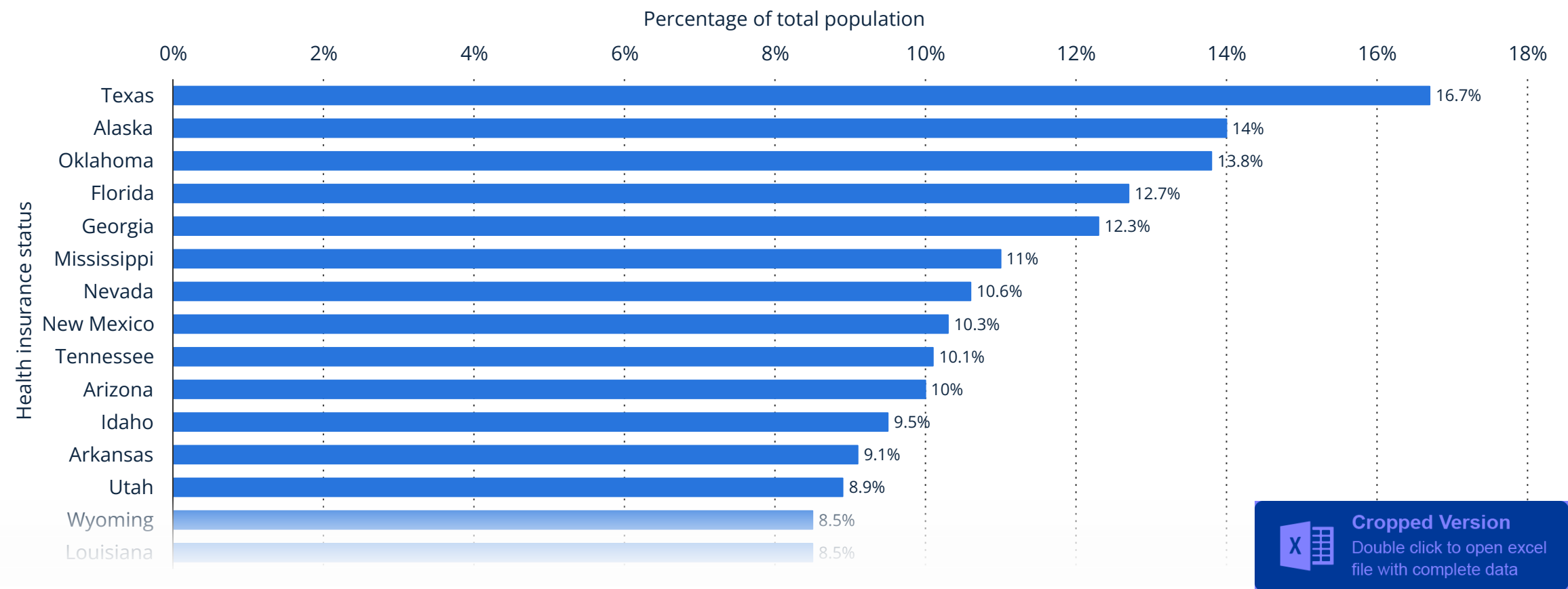

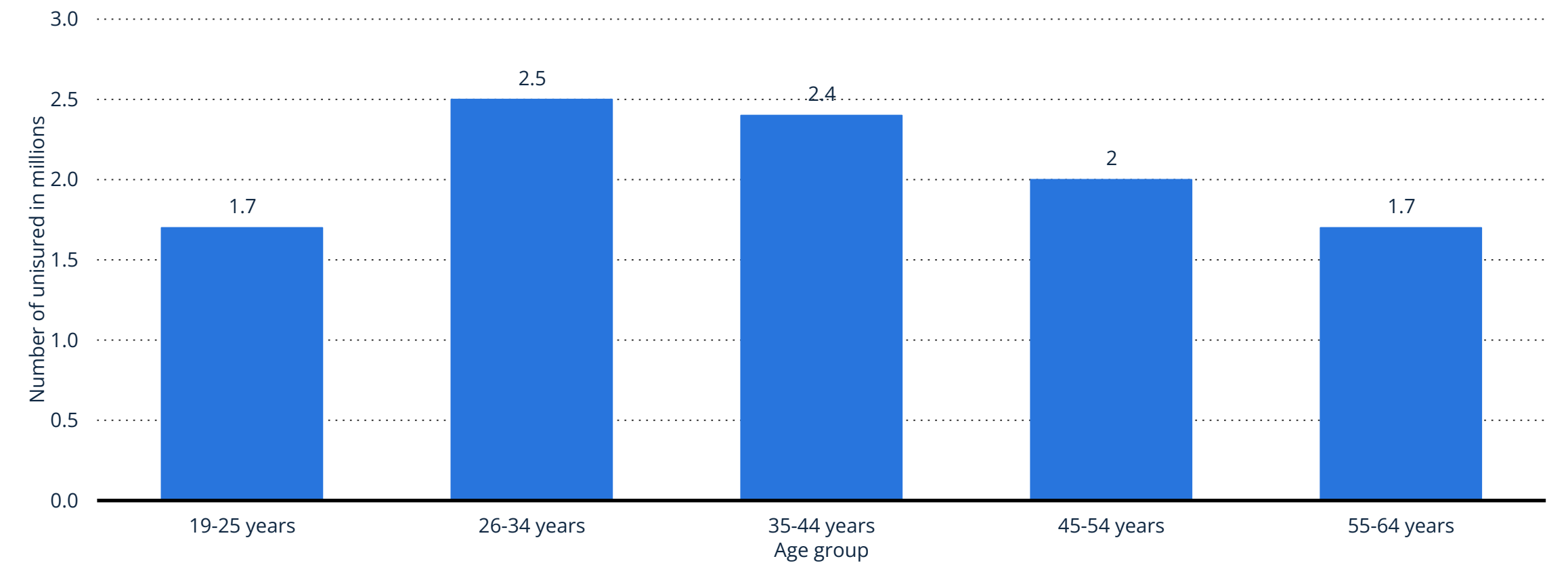

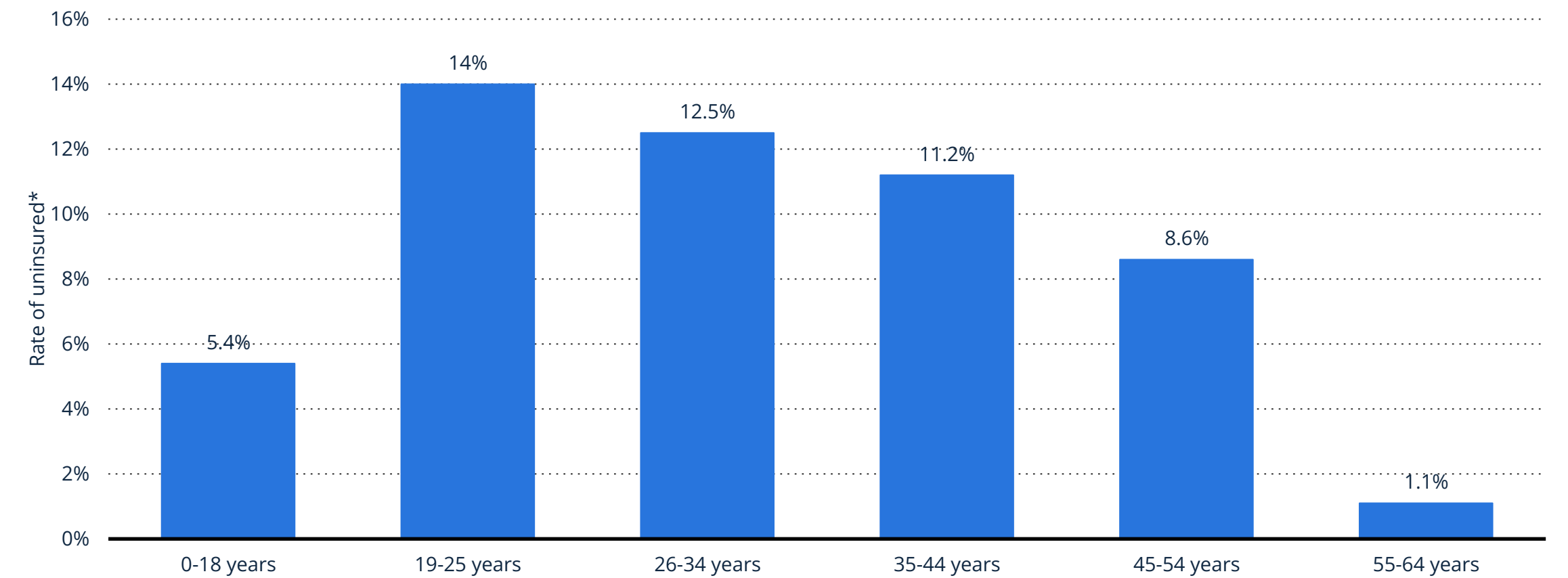
Number of adult women without health insurance in the U.S. in 2021, by age (in millions)

Uninsured U.S. adult women in 2021 by age



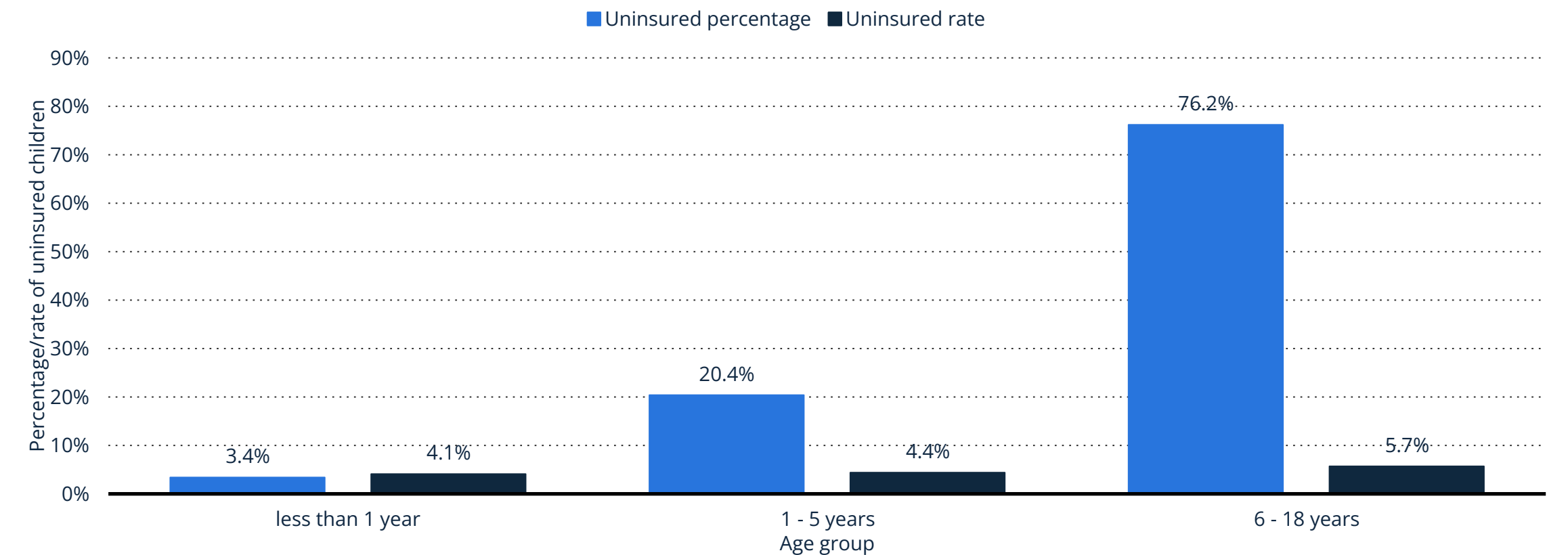
Proportion of of non-elderly people without health insurance in the U.S. in 2022, by age

Uninsured rate of U.S. non-elderly population by age 2022



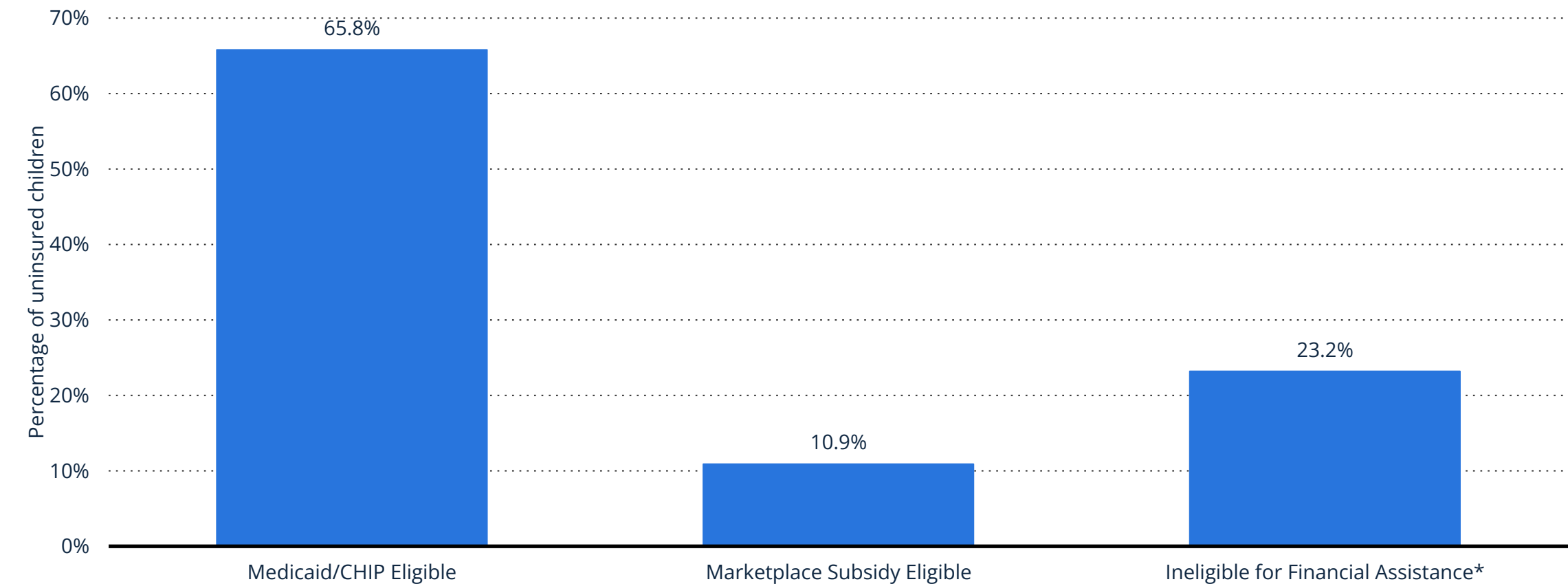
Percentage and rate of children without health insurance in the U.S. in 2021, by age group

Share of uninsured U.S. children eligible for health coverage by eligibility 2020

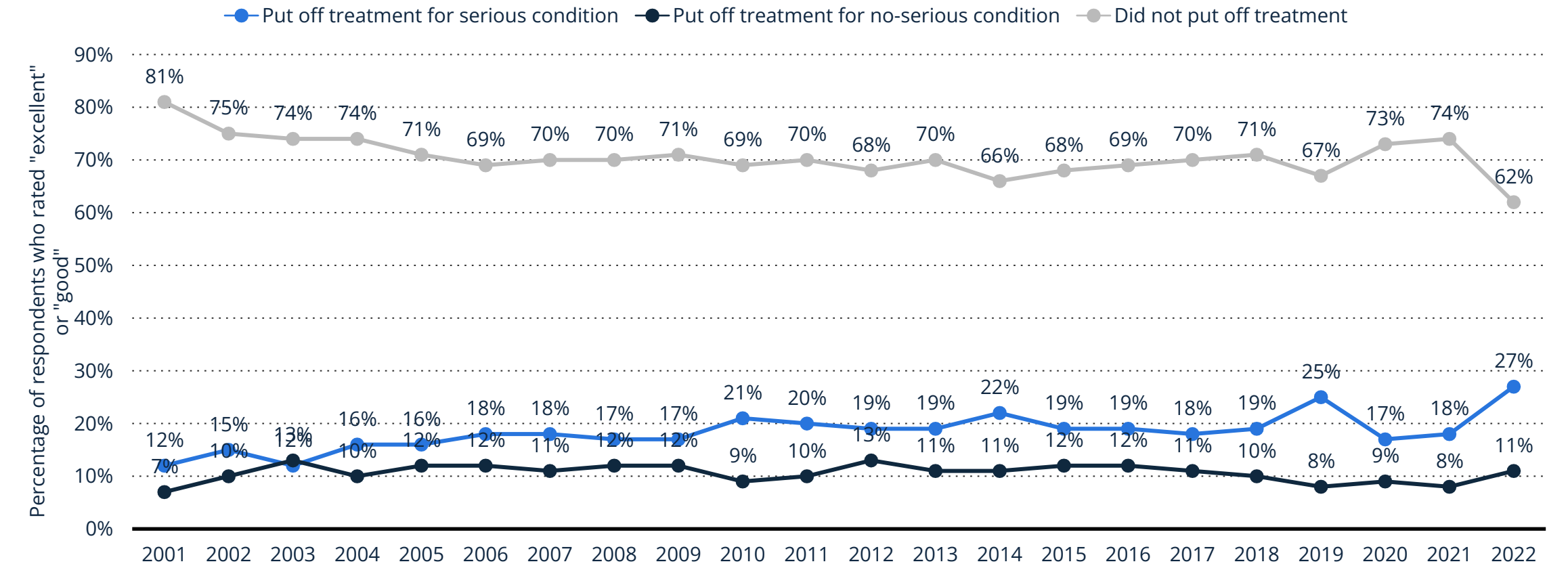

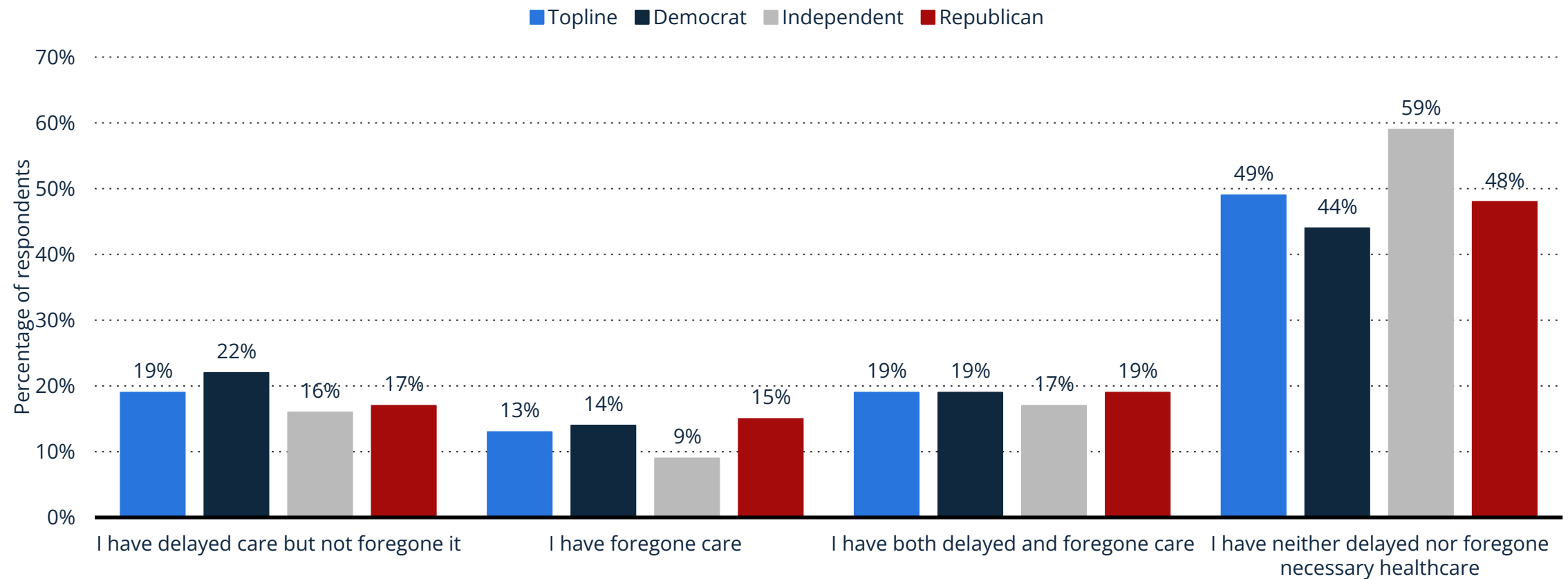
Within the last twelve months, have you or a member of your family put off any sort of medical treatment because of the cost you would have to pay? (U.S. 2001-2022)

Delaying medical treatment due to cost U.S. 2001-2022



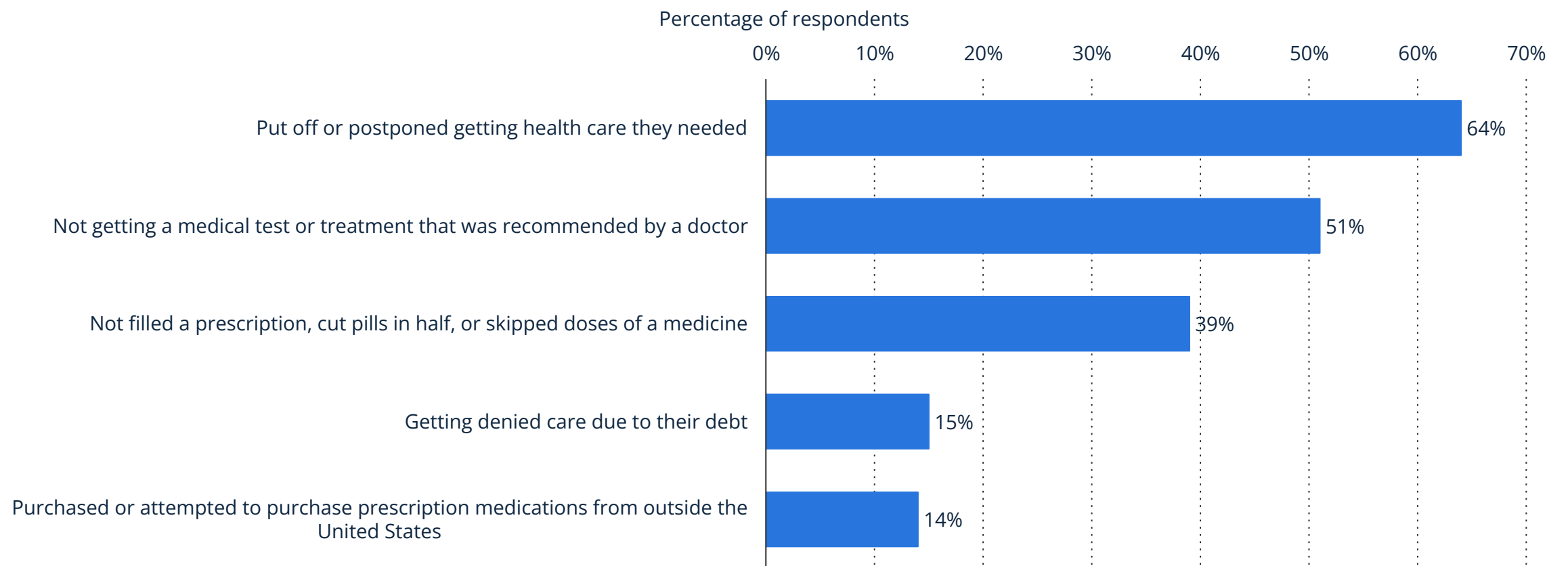
Percentage of adults who delayed or forewent necessary health care due to costs in the U.S. in 2020, by political orientation

Adults who delayed health care due to costs U.S. 2020, by political orientation



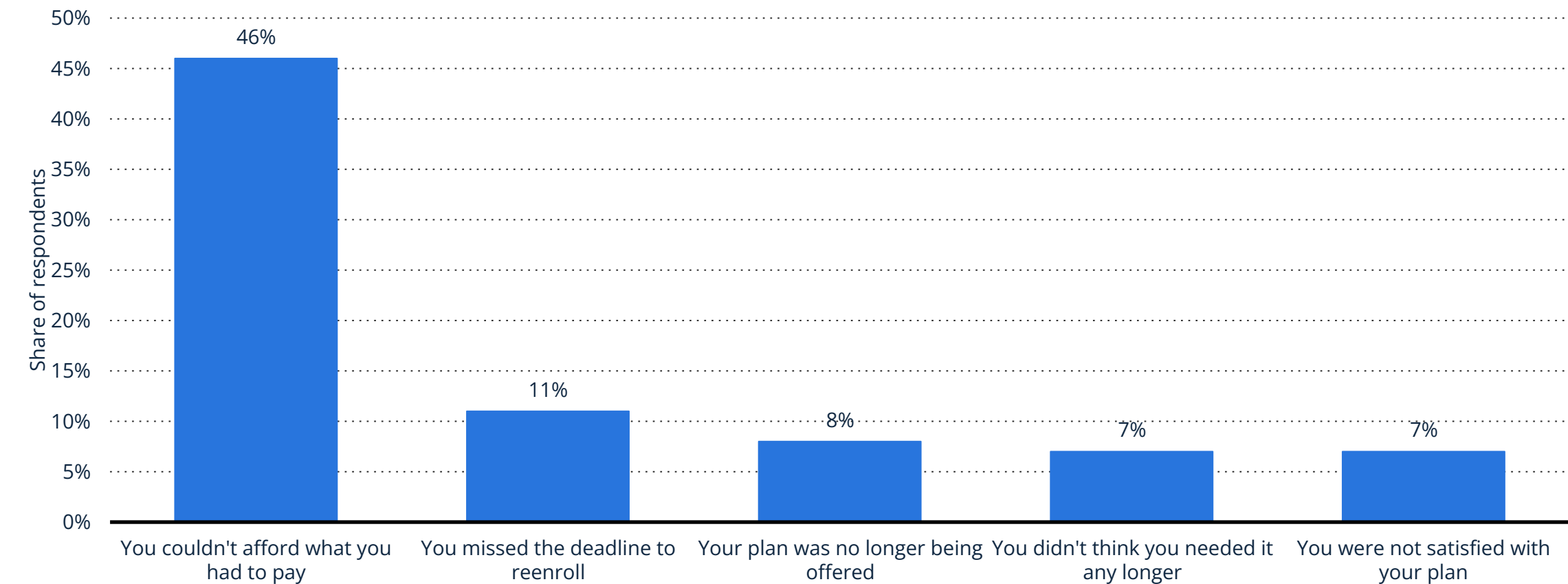
Share of adults with health care debt and health care debt-related barriers to accessing care in the U.S. in 2022

Share of healthcare debt-related barriers to accessing care in the U.S. in 2022



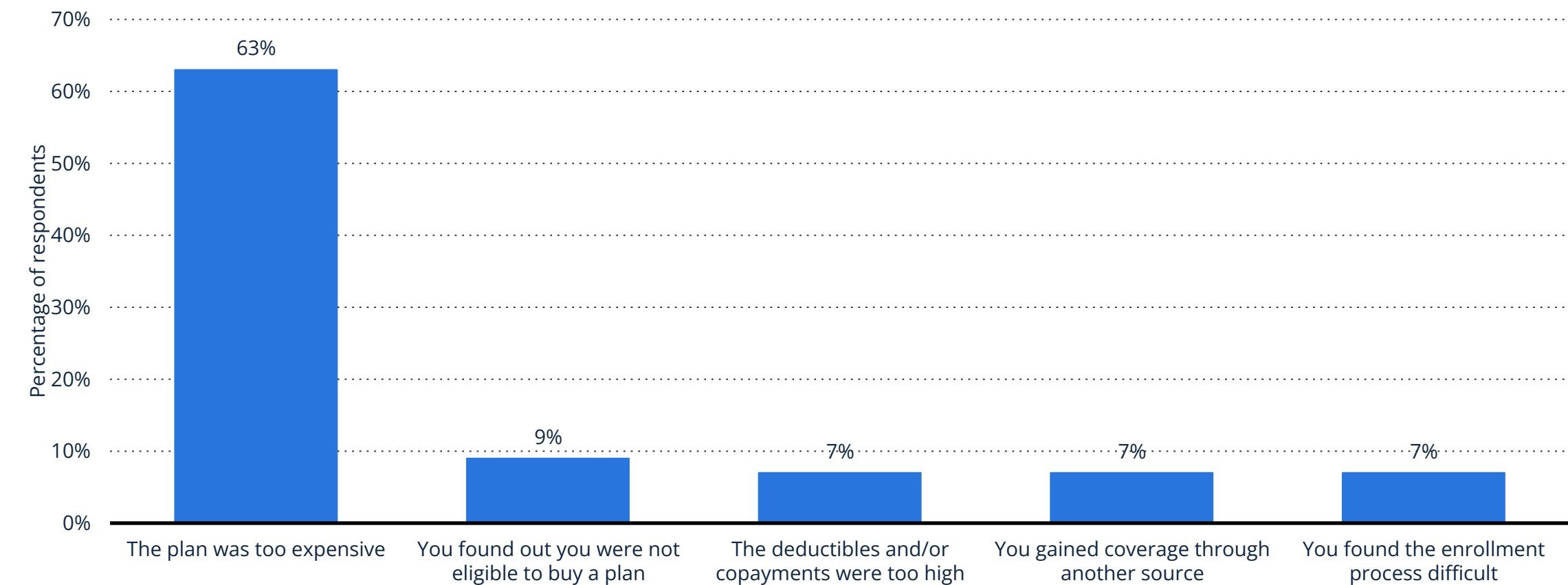
What was the main reason you lost or dropped coverage?
