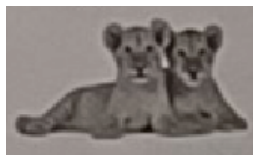

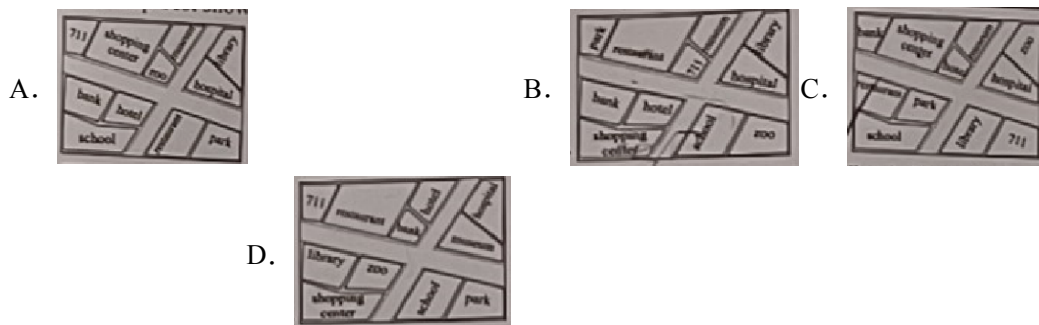

They have big ears like fans. Their skin is grayblack. They have some short hairs on their backs and tails. Male (公) elephants live alone or in small groups. Female elephants live together with their babies.

An Elephant's Food

Elephants must eat most of the day to get enough food they need. They eat grasses, leaves, and bark (树皮) from trees. An elephant must drink lots of water, too.



An elephant's trunk has many uses. An elephant uses it to pick up food and put food into its mouth. An elephant drinks by sucking (吸) up water into its trunk. Then the elephant squirts (喷射) the water into its mouth. Elephants use their trunks to greet each other. They hold their trunks high to catch smells in the air. The tip of the trunk can pick one berry off a bush.
